Last week we wrote about decks. Several folks have asked for more information about deck materials and railing designs.

Most decks are built with a wood structure and a composite material or decay resistant natural woods for the weathering or walking surface. Composite materials are typically made from reclaimed wood fibers and either new or recycled plastic resins. Decay resistant woods used in our area are typically Cedar and Redwood. Composite decking usually costs a little more than redwood or cedar but the maintenance is very minimal if at all. The woods should be sealed each year (or at the least every other year) to maintain their beautiful grain and colors. Composites do not. While some composite colors can fade in the higher ultraviolet rays of our sun, some do not. Depending on the manufacturer, your color choices and drainage needs we can help make the best choice for your home.
